It also aims at academics and students specializing in international criminal law. Additionally, researchers and professionals interested in evidentiary procedures within the ICC will find this book insightful.

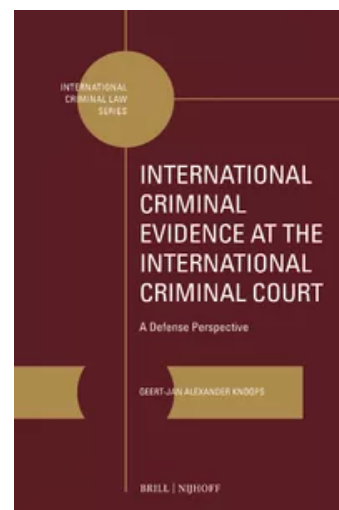
